This summary details the statistical results of the 180 Degrees Program during the first semester of the 2012-2013 school - year at the following 8 high schools in the East Side Union High School District.

Andrew Hill High School 1 class, 33 students Independence High School 1 classes, 25 students
Mt Pleasant High School 7 classes, 162 students
Oak Grove High School 2 classes, 37 students]
Piedmont Hills High School 1 class, 20 students
Silver Creek High School 1 class, 29 students
Overfelt High School 2 classes, 37 students
Yerba Buena High School 1 class, 17 students
During the first semester, approximately August 14, 2012 to December 20, 2012, a total of 360 students enrolled in the program at 8 high schools: Grade levels of the participating students were 173-9th grade students, 181-10th grade students, 2 - 11th grade students and 4-12th grade students. The 180 Degrees Program training was incorporated into the school district's regular school day schedule.

Teachers assigned to instruct the 180 Degrees Program classes were trained as 180 Facilitators.

The demographic make-up of the students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program classes at the 8 participating schools the 1st Semester of the 2012-2013 school year was 152 Female (42.2\%); 208 Male (57.8\%); 19 African American (5.3\%); 2 American Indian (0.6\%); 11 Asian (3.1\%); 8 Caucasian (2.2\%); 296 Hispanic (82.2\%); 1 Middle Eastern (0.3\%); 6 Pacific Islander (1.7\%); 17 Other/Unknown (4.7\%).

Progress of the students was measured by a pre and post program comparative analysis of the students' GPA's, Core Grades (Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies and Sciences), Full Day Absences, Documented Disciplinary Incidents and surveys measuring the rate of progress of the students' Life Skills developments. The data was collected from school records and Personal Development Surveys and entered into the 180 Degrees Program Electronic Data Base. In addition, daily attendance of the students in the 180 classes was recorded and entered into the data base.

The following average results were obtained during the first semester by the schools participating in the 180 Degrees Program:

GPA's available for 242 of the 314 students that remained in the program increased +12.5\%


Full Day Unexcused Absences available for 238 of the 314 students that remained in the program decreased $\boldsymbol{7 5 8 . 1 \%}$


Combined Documented Disciplinary Incident records available for 241 of the 314 students that remained in the program decreased $\neg \mathbf{7 1 . 8 \%}$


Personal Development Surveys rating the progress of the students that remained in the program were completed by the Students, Facilitators, Teachers and Parents rating the progress of the students from the beginning of the course to the end of the first semester. Each life skill area was rated 1-Poor, 2-Fair, 3-Good, 4-Excellent and 5-Superior.

A total of 33 students enrolled in one class; 2-11th grade students, 27-10th grade students and 4-12th grade students.

The demographic make-up of the students was 18 Female (54.5\%); 15 Male (45.5\%); 2 African American (6.1\%); 25 Hispanic (75.8\%); 1 Pacific Islander (3.0\%) and 5 Other/unknown (15.2\%).

GPA's available for the 26 students that remained in the program increased 0.74 to 1.36 (+83.8\%).

Full Day Absences available for 25 of the 29 students that remained in the program decreased 254 to 28 (-89.0\%).

Combined Documented Disciplinary Incident records available for 25 of the 29 students that remained in the program decreased 94 to 5 (-94.7\%).

GPA's available for the 16 students that remained in the program increased 0.29 to 1.38 (+375.9\%).

Caucasian (8.1\%); 32 Hispanic (86.5\%); 2 Other/Unknown (5.4\%).
GPA's available for 23 of the 24 students that remained in the program decreased 2.1 to 1.85 (-11.9\%).

Full Day Unexcused Absences available for 23 of the 24 students that remained in the program increased 16 to 46 (+187.5\%).

GPA's available for the 24 students that remained in the program decreased 2.11 to 1.74 (-7.5\%).

Full Day Unexcused Absences for the 24 students that remained in the program increased 7 to 13 (+85.7\%).
